Barren Grounds Nature Reserve is 14km along the Jamberoo Mountain Road from the Pie Shop and the picnic parking area is about 1km in from the entrance.

Instead of a Friday night talk this October we will have a 2-4km return walk on easy tracks to see the display of wildflowers in the Nature Reserve. At this time of year the two species of Boronia (*B.thujona* and *B.barkeriana*) are in flower as well as many other kinds of heath wildflowers.

There will be time to identify and photograph flowers so bring plant books and cameras if you like. Wear a hat, sensible shoes and clothes that allow for changeable weather; bring your lunch and a drink in a backpack to have out on the track if the day is fine.
